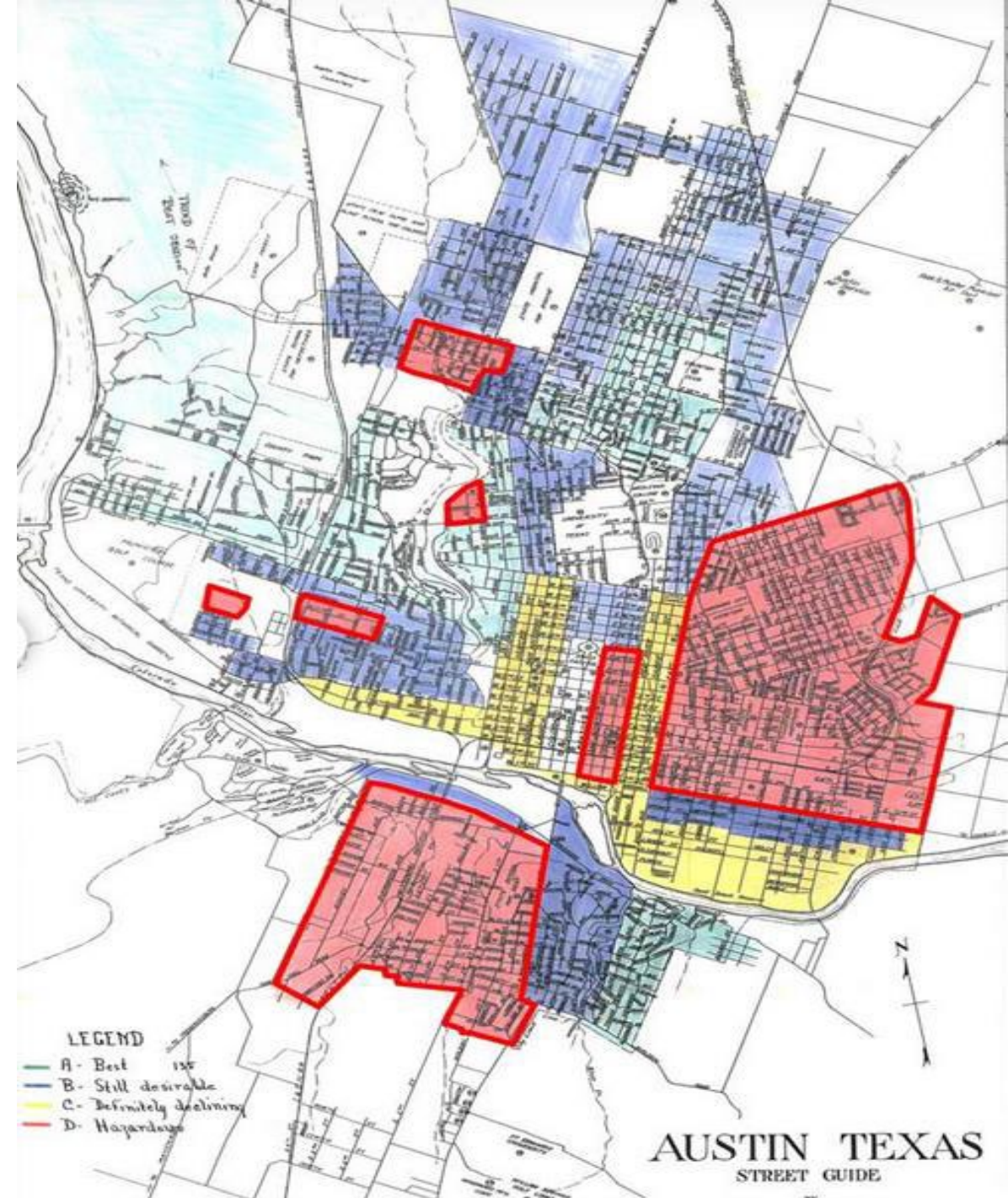
Huston-Tillotson University

- Historically Black College or University (HBCU) in Austin, TX
- ~1100 students
 - 67% Black, 30% Hispanic
 - 50% first generation
 - 95% Federal Student Aid (73% Pell recipients)
- East Austin is a historically segregated, now gentrifying area of Austin.



Unifying Theme: How have the legacies of American slavery impacted and continue to impact the health of Austin's Black community?

Lenses: environmental justice; social determinants of health; health disparity



Create and Heal

Create and Heal is a program of the Carver Museum that focuses on helping our community process state-sanctioned violence against Black and Brown in the United States. The Carver partners with Austin-based artists and activists to provide workshops where participants can share their thoughts and feelings and participate in healing arts.

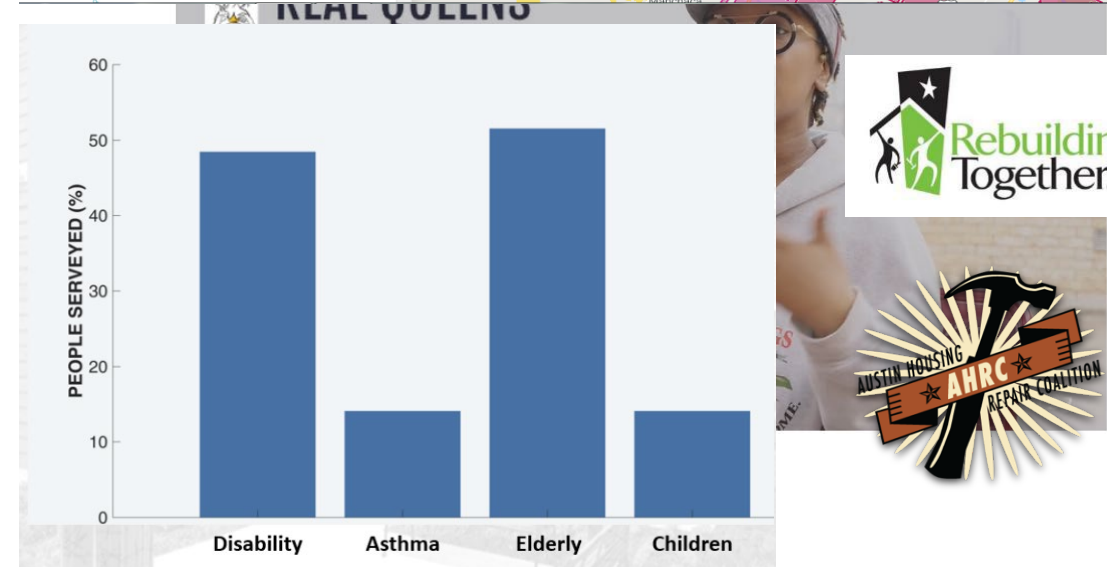
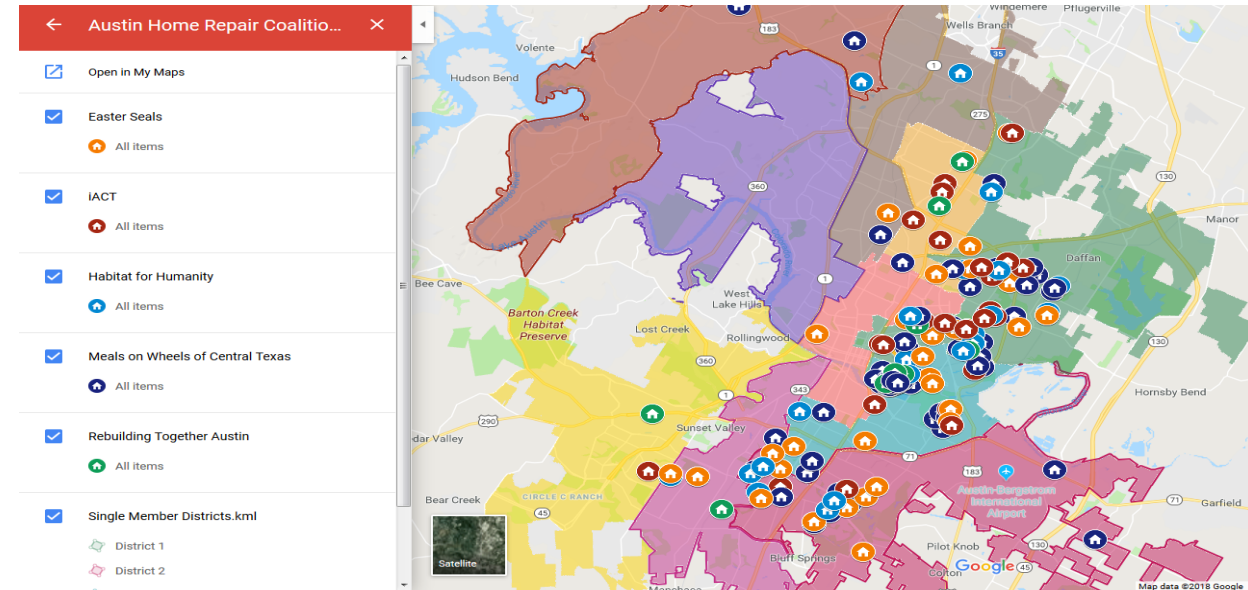


Indoor Air intervention pilot project builds on affordable housing research.
